I have been interested in animals since my childhood and my love of dogs stayed with me all my life. I was allways fascinated by variety of dog breeds. In 1986 I purchased my first Basset Hound and studying them along with other canine breeds became an important part of my life and that my family. Our kennel Bohemia Horrido was founded in 1992 and has a long list of champions Basset Hounds and Braque d'Auvergne. Today I can watch with pleasure the succes of my daughter Eva, who is following the breeding and is, along with others, an author of the official logo of the world show 2021 and european show in 2025.

I was a founder member of Basset Club CZ in 1991 and since 2008 I am secretary of Scenthound Club CZ. In 1998 my first and only original book about Basset Hounds in my native language was published. Its extended edition concerning all Basset breeds was published in 2012. I translate F.C.I. breed standards for czech kennel club ČMKU.

I started my judging career in 2001 and now I am international F.C.I. judge for F.C.I. groups 4, 6 and 7 and I am specialized in scent hounds across all F.C.I. groups. I never miss an oportunity to extend my knowledge. I have attended several judge seminars by UK, American and Australian lecturers and accredited trainers in my country as well as in England and USA. I judged many scent hound and pointing breeds on international, national, special and club shows in Czech Republic, Slovakia, Austria, Germany, Belgium, Switzerland, Poland, Lithuania, Denmark, Sweden, Finnland, Hungary, Italy, Portugal, United Kingdom, Russia and Australia, mostly of Rhodesian Ridgebacks, Beagles, Basset Hounds, Dalmatians and Weimaraners. I was honoured to judge Dalmatians at the F.C.I. World Dog Show 2021 in my country. I consider the highligh of my judging career the appointment by The Basset Hound Club in 2023 - judging Championship Show in the land of breeds origin, Great Britain.

I am looking forvard very much to judge the club show of hunting breeds in Latvia in 2025.
